## Objective

### “Peace or Collapse: In Search of New Horizons for Geopolitics”

Climate change and the ecological devastation wrought by our global industrial civilization are an urgent reality. That reality demands profound reflection on everything we have taken for granted, including our beliefs and desires, and our perceptions and culture. What exactly must we do about the historical task that confronts us in this era?

We need insight into the heart of the crisis. We need to focus on the reality that confronts us in connection with the universe, the planet, and humanity. These limitations cannot be superseded through narrow-minded, human-centered modern knowledge that separates the human from the other, and culture from nature. What are we, and what should we seek? These are the questions we must examine along with the wellspring of human existence.

We must ponder what our role is on this planet that is being destroyed by humanity. We must correct the environmental and ecological evils that humanity has triggered and go out in search of new horizons for values oriented on future sustainability and new potential. That will necessitate a perceptual shift leading to a transformation of our daily lives.

We need to open new horizons for a politics oriented on the future of global citizens. We need global civic society to show solidarity and unity and action so as to surmount the myopia of realpolitik and the survival logic of “every man for himself.” We need the wisdom and action to rise above greed and the delusion of infinite growth and pay attention to the devastation of our planet. We need to open future horizons that will enable humanity and our civilization to coexist with nature and the planet and to thrive together.

By organizing this Peace BAR Festival to celebrate the 41st UN International Day of Peace, Kyung Hee University System seeks a plan of action to overcome the crisis as we contemplate the watchword of our era: “evolve or perish.” As future citizens, we urge you to join us on our journey toward the opportunities that await beyond this crisis.

## The Background of the International Day of Peace

The International Day and Year of Peace was established in 1981 by the United Nations under the initiative of Dr. Young Seek Choue, the founder of the Kyung Hee University System (penname, Miwon). Dr. Choue first proposed the idea at the 6th Triennial Conference of the International Association of University Presidents (IAUP) held in San Jose, Costa Rica in 1981. The proposal was incorporated into the Costa Rican Resolution which the IAUP adopted at said conference and sent to the UN. On November 30, the same year, the 36th UN General Assembly approved the resolution, thereby officially establishing the International Day of Peace and the International Year of Peace.

The UN General Assembly declared in its resolution 36/67 that the International Day of Peace has been established to “commemorate and strengthen the ideals of peace both within and among all nations and peoples,” and invited “all Member States, organs and organizations of the United Nations system, regional organizations, non-governmental organizations, peoples and individuals to commemorate in an appropriate manner the International Day of Peace, especially through all means of education.” Since then the UN proclaimed every third Tuesday of September as the ‘International Day of Peace’ (fixed as September 21st in 2001) and 1986 as the ‘International Year of Peace.’

The forecast of IAUP that the weakening of the Cold War regime would contribute to world peace was timely. At the time when the International Day and Year of Peace was being proposed, the tension between East and West also faced a new era with the proclamation of the International Year of Peace. On January 1st, 1988, US President Reagan and Soviet General Secretary Gorbachev shared New Year’s greetings of peace to each other’s nation. The two countries then held disarmament talks to ban all ballistic missiles and made efforts to end regional conflicts, paving the way for peace. Since then, a plan to reduce nuclear weapons has been prepared and efforts to resolve regional disputes have continued to ease tensions in the Cold War regime.

Under the main theme of "Peace or Collapse: In Search of New Horizons for Geopolitics," the festival seeks to diagnose the crisis of civilization that confronts us all. ## Round Table Discussion Commemorating International Day of Peace

The round table discussion that has been organized to commemorate this year's International Day of Peace will seek solutions for our crisis around the theme of "Onset of Disaster: In Search of the Gateway of New Life." Human society today is overshadowed by the prospect of collapse as we face the onslaught of the total catastrophe of global warming. It is time to prepare for the worst-case scenario of this global catastrophe. Earth is turning into a planet that is no longer capable of supporting humanity. Heat waves as high as 50°C sweep locations around the globe, including Europe, the Americas, and East Asia; fierce fires consume lush fields and forests; the cryosphere is rapidly melting; torrential downpours flood the deserts; extreme droughts lay bare riverbeds around the world; and pandemics proliferate. In addition, geopolitical instability among the great powers, in Ukraine, in East Asia, and in the Middle East has made nuclear war more likely than ever before. We have no more time to delay; we are running out of time. We need to seek out the gateway for new life that can make this emerald planet safe and sustainable again. We are in urgent need of a transformation if we are to evade the climate catastrophe and the crisis of nuclear annihilation. We need to take action and adopt a new perspective on humanity, nature, civilization, and the universe. It is critical that we halt the rampage of our material production and consumption, our greed for endless growth, our rash conflicts, and our hegemonic rivalry, and that we develop an ethics of mutual care and consideration that will enable the coexistence of life on our planet in all its precious forms.

## Miwon Dr. Young Seek Choue, Credited for Proposing the UN International Day of Peace

  - Pioneered the 'Live-Well Movement,' 'National Forestation Movement,' 'World Peace Movement,' 'Bright Society Movement,' and 'Neo-Renaissance Movement'
  - Proposed the UN International Day of Peace and International Year of Peace in 1981, which were adopted by the 36th UN General Assembly
  - Hosted the 1999 Seoul International Conference of NGOs
  - **Awarded** the Dag Hammarskjöld Prize, the UN Peace Medal, the Albert Einstein Peace Prize, the Mahatma M. K. Gandhi Prize for Non-Violent Peace, the Korean government's official Order of Civil Merit, Mugunghwa Medal, and the Manhae Peace Prize.
  - **Published** 'The Theory of Democratic Freedoms'(1948), 'The Creation of a Civilized World'(1951), 'Reconstruction of the Human Society'(1975) and 'Oughtopia'(1979)

Dr. Choue was an intellectual and educator who believed in acting on his beliefs as a world peace theorist and activist. At the core of his activism was his call for a global community that practices 'peace and creation'. Such a global community would be free of war and disease, where creative cultures flourish on the strength of holistic education and a shared commitment to public goods. Dr. Choue's world peace movement was oriented toward putting into practice universal public values in service of a peaceful world that transcends national and ethnic boundaries.

Dr. Choue spearheaded momentous national and global initiatives. They include the 'Agricultural Development Movement' and 'Live-Well Movement' aimed at helping Korea rise from the ashes of war, and the 'Nature Preservation Movement,' 'Bright Society Movement,' and 'World Peace Movement' geared toward steering the world away from the blind pursuit of growth and expansion, and the shackles of the Cold War. In 1965, Dr. Choue led the founding of the International Association of University Presidents (IAUP). In 1981, he proposed the 'UN International Day of Peace and International Year of Peace,' which were later adopted and declared by the UN. This was followed by the publication of The World Peace Encyclopedia in 1987 and the hosting of the Seoul International NGO Conference in 1999.

Dr. Choue dedicated his adult life to bringing out a transition in human civilization that rejects exclusive competition and war in favor of global peace. He condemned modern civilization for being obsessed with a myth of limitless growth at the cost of destroying Earth's limited environment and ecosystems. These ideas are encapsulated in his vision of 'Oughtopia.' Along with being the 41st year since the designation of the UN International Day of Peace, 2022 also marks the 10th anniversary of the passing of Dr. Young Seek Choue.
